President's Message

200th Anniversary of Oktoberfest

The 200th Anniversary celebration of Oktoberfest at the German American Society of Pinellas County has concluded. This Bavarian tradition, whose origins date back to 1810, was celebrated with fanfare and pomp under a big tent on our property. It was a chance for the people of Tampa Bay to experience and enjoy a unique and most authentic presentation of this historically significant festival.

By most measures, it was the biggest success in our societies history. Over 3,600 people celebrated this unique event with us; that is twice the number from last year. We were blessed with great weather and despite record crowds, most visitors enjoyed the great food, drink and gemütlichkeit.

In addition to the dozens of kegs of beer imbibed, our visitors also consumed over 1,000 lbs. of Potatoes, 260 lbs of Onions, 500 lbs. of Pork Loins, 75 lbs. Leberkase, 500 lbs. of a variety of Wursts, 2,000 Rolls, 64 loaves of Willie Frueh's

special German Bread, 760 Bavarian Pretzels imported from Mannheim, Germany and over 2,000 slices of hausgemacht (home made) Apple Strudel & Black Forest Cake.

Our Oktoberfest is truly the most authentic event of its type in Tampa Bay. No other Oktoberfest in the area comes close to having our warm atmosphere or celebrates the tradition and history of Oktoberfest or offers the variety and quality of food found in our Prince Ludwig's Food Court.

Our nightly parade of flags was a big hit. Members wore their tracht (German costumes), carried the flags of all the 16 German states, the Honorary Burgermeister tapped the keg with the pronouncement of "O'Zafpt Is" and we sang both the American and German National Anthems.

The Kinder Korner was a big hit again this year providing parents with an opportunity to enjoy the festival.

With our tent twice the size of last we were able to add more than 330 seats. On our busiest night we had over 900 guests. During the 3 weeks over 200 seats were reserved and prepaid for groups of 10 or more.

Success did not come without difficulty or sacrifice. On a Sat. night the crowd grew so large we ran out of seats and the wait on the food line reached 45 minutes.

I apologize to our guests for any inconvenience. And I thank our members for stepping up to the

challenge. On the last weekend we made changes to improve the experience for our guests. We added many more tables and chairs and made changes to speed up food and beer service.

Special thanks goes to all our volunteers both members and non-members, too numerous to mention here and especially for the personal sacrifices by so many.

Particularly noteworthy were the efforts of **Helmut Drews**, who performed so many different tasks which contributed to the success of the festival. Everyone knows Helmut makes those delicious Potato Pancakes and Rosettes starting from scratch. Every evening he entertained our guests with our Drehorgl (street organ) and his squeeze box (accordion). He also worked in the kitchen during the week helping Karl Klumpp make our fabulous Apple Strudel. On Sat. night of the second weekend, while driving home he had an auto accident. Caused most likely by fatigue, the accident fortunately did not result in personal injury, but did put his van in the auto hospital for days. None of this adversity tempered Helmut's enthusiasm. He never waned and even when the Oktoberfest was over, Helmut came to the club on Sunday and worked from 10 am to 8 pm making 500 of his fabulous potato pancakes from the remaining ingredients. We now have these in our freezer ready to reheat and serve on Sat. nights.

Otto Noeding, also deserves special recognition for the multitude of tasks

Folk Fair

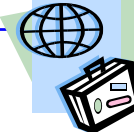

Berlin Festival of Lights

Each fall the Festival of Lights turns Berlin into a sparkling metropolis as artistic illuminations give city landmarks a new look. The city's world-famous historic sites, like the Brandenburg Gate, the television tower in the East and the radio tower in the West, the modern Potsdamer Platz and museums, among others, are staged by means of lights, projections and fireworks.

Cultural events around the city complement the light installations. One tradition is a run that includes passing through the illuminated Brandenburg Gate. About 6,000 people took part in the LightRun in 2009. The 2010 festival runs from October 13 to 24. In 2011, the Festival of Lights will take place from October 19 to 30.

John Rabe

In 1937, John Rabe was a German businessman working for Siemens in Nanking, China. He and his wife were happily celebrating his imminent retirement and return to Europe when they were swept up in a brutal assault on the city that had been their home for several years.

Based on actual events, John Rabe tells the story of how Rabe rescued more than 200,000 civilians during the "Nanking Massacre", when thousands of Chinese civilians and disarmed soldiers were murdered and an estimated 20,000 to 80,000 women were raped by soldiers of the Imperial Japanese Army.

"Drawing from John Rabe's 1937

diaries as source material, Academy Award winner Florian Gallenberger has crafted a portrait of a man revered as a saint in China to this day and yet never rewarded for his courage during his lifetime," film distributor Strand Releasing said in a statement.

John Rabe was an official selection at the Berlin Film Festival and is a winner of four Golden Lolas, Germany's top film prize, for best film best actor, best costume and best production design. Written and directed by Florian Gallenberger, *John Rabe* stars Ulrich Tukur, Steve Buscemi, Daniel Brühl and Anne Consigny.

Buscemi, who has appeared in several Coen Brothers films and stars in the HBO original series "Boardwalk Empire", takes an intense turn in *John Rabe* as an American doctor. The scenes between veteran German actor Tukur and an initially sceptical Buscemi bristle with intensity in this gritty yet ultimately uplifting drama that highlights how a handful of brave expatriates worked selflessly round the clock to help thousands of people trapped in a grim life-or-death scenario.

Daniel Brühl, the fresh-faced star of *Goodbye Lenin* (2003), moreover sparkles in a romantic subplot that provides relief from the bloody battles raging just beyond the sanctuary John Rabe strives so ferociously to maintain. His truly heroic and charitable effort is not unlike that of Oskar Schindler as portrayed by Liam Neeson in Steven Spielberg's award-winning *Schindler's List*.

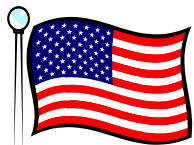
